1 Corinthians 12:27
















"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates."

Deuteronomy 6:4-9

It is so easy to read this passage and think that Moses must be addressing parents and families – but look closely at who is being addressed. All of Israel. The culture of the Israelites was that of a community. As a parent and someone invested in working with our children and youth, I believe one of the greatest values of the Church is its potential to provide community for our Next Generation.

What does that community look like? Well, for one thing, it's about being a place where children and youth can show up and be safe. I was so grateful that so many people stayed for the Ministry Safe Child Protection training this past month! All adults working with youth and children will need to have this training, as well as undergo a thorough background check. Our Vision Leadership Team also took part in the training so they can understand, know, and help carry out a culture of safety for all our children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Thank you to those who were able to complete the training and please be in touch with me as soon as possible if you need information on going through the training on your own. We will soon be starting the Background Check process – I will be in touch with those of you needing them soon!







Another way that "community" is demonstrated is when our kids or youth can have meaningful conversations with adults. Sometimes those talks can be challenging - working through doubts or struggles. And sometimes they can be time-consuming and unpredictable. But the "relationship investment" is always worth it, as having a consistent, caring adult is sometimes THE thing that makes a difference in a young person's life and ensures that they grow in the knowledge and grace of Jesus! Special thanks to Gary Smallwood for stepping in to lead the youth Sunday School class when Noah had to miss a few weeks recently! And to all who have worked so hard to learn our kid's names and stories - thank you for SEEING them!

We are now moving into the month of April. April is known for things like April fool's Day and our tax deadline. With God, every month is a time of grace, whether we file taxes or not. Before I share with you about our up and coming month, I want to say that we had a great time of ministry in the month of March. We had a great time living out Lent and learning about our Good Shepherd together. I really was blessed as your pastor to lead our family through the 23rd Psalm. There was so much grace in that simple chapter of the Bible. We had a glorious holy week experience. Palm Sunday was a powerful time in worship. Good Friday was an amazing time led by eight people in our church blending together the Passion of Christ and the 23rd Psalm. From the opening song to the closing prayer of Good Friday, our minds and hearts were taken on a journey of love as we saw, tasted, heard, and felt the truth of the 23rd Psalm. Then on Saturday morning, we teamed up with three other churches and the City of Chickasaw Recreation Department to create a morning that children will remember for a long time. We were able to count at least 200 children there and over 3000 eggs were hidden that day. Next on Sunday morning, we arrived at the amphitheater to join in with people from four other churches to uplift the name of Jesus. Then, we had a full house in our sanctuary on Sunday morning as we celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus together. I also want to thank the very good turnout of church leaders who took time on March 10th to complete the ministry safe training.

This month, I will be preaching about the Christian life from a different perspective by looking at the foundation of our faith as listed out in Hebrews 6:1-2. This list of the foundation of faith include things that we wouldn't normally expect and then leaves out other things that we would assume would be there. I am naming the sermon series "Foundations of Faith......Not What You Expected." Some of the seven items named, we expected, but others will give us a double-take. I will be sharing why things like the "laying on of hands" is on the list. More importantly, I will be sharing about the principle behind this inclusion that we need to live into. Many people miss out of the abundance of life that Jesus wants to give them because they don't understand these principles of Christian living.

This month, we will support the larger annual conference family of church by hosting an Emmaus Reunion on April 21st. We are excited that one of Bobby and Sandy Smallwood's grandchildren, Taylor Bray, will be getting married in our sanctuary on April 6th. A number of our ladies will be taking part in a ladies' retreat on April 26-28th. The month of April is shaping up to be a month of growth and life for us a church. May will also be an exciting month where we celebrate our high school graduates as well as celebrate our mothers on Mother's Day. Three of us from our church will be taking part in the second annual conference of the Alabama Emerald Coast Annual Conference on May 5-7th. Then, in recognition of our restart as a church in May of last year, we will have homecoming Sunday May 19th with Lester Spencer sharing with us.



We had 28 people in our church get certified on March 10th through Ministry Safe so that we can all work together in keeping our children and Youth taken care of and out of harm's way in our church. This is something that we as a church are extremely passionate about.



Wearing the Armor of God


- · Know the truth of God's word- read scripture and memorize it!
- · Live a righteous life. We all know you cannot be sinless, but you can strive to be obedient in everything you do. Ask- what would Jesus do?- before doing anything. Confess your sins and keep trying when you fall!
- Be ready so you can always have the peace that passes all understanding. Know the enemy is going to attack and be prepared. Rest in the peace of knowing God will be there through it all!
- Have faith that God has ultimately won the war. Trust in Him no matter what happens!
- · Accept the salvation offered to us through following Jesus and obey His Word!
- Pray. Pray without ceasing. Don't ever stop. Bring everything to the Lord praying in the mighty, powerful name of Jesus!

The Armor of God Ephesians 6:10-18

10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. 14 Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, 15 and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. 16 In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

18 And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people

Put it to practice: on Sunday mornings when you come to church, put on your armor! Don't let the difficulties you are facing hinder you from true worship. In fact, use that pain, heartache or fear you might be feeling and pour that into your worship! Let that be what you lay

Our New Governance team met on Sunday, February the 26th. We spent a good bit of the three hour meeting listening to each other and seeking to better understand the challenges facing us as a church. It was a serious, but a spiritually rich time together. One decision we made was to move our homecoming Sunday to a different date. The reasons were that November is a jam-packed month with the Turkey Dinner and Thanksgiving. Also, we became a new church on the third weekend in May of last year when the Alabama West Florida Annual Conference voted us out of the annual conference. Therefore, we will have Homecoming this year on May 19th, the third Sunday in May. We are excited that our new annual conference's President Pro Tempore, Lester Spencer, will be our preacher this year. There are still many people in our church that remember his uncle, Lamar Spencer who was our pastor from 1963 to 1968. Lester's dad, Lester Sr., was the pastor at St Mark Methodist Church from 1957 to 1969. The picture attached to his article is a horseback ride that Lester Sr. did from Mobile to Baltimore, Maryland in honor of the 1966 general conference. Lester has told me that he had a number of relative living in Chickasaw during the 60's and 70's, so in a sense we are inviting an old friend of our community to be with us. It is thought that Lester will be the first bishop of our new annual conference as we move forward. Having Lester with us for Homecoming is truly an exciting event as we move into the new future that God has for us.
