PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

"Now you are no longer strangers to God and foreigners to heaven, but you are members of God's very own family, citizens of God's country, and you belong in God's household with every other Christian." Ephesians 2:19 TLB

The year 2024 is upon us. The seasonal changes will happen as they do each year. The day and night cycles will happen, and the months will come and go. What will happen in my heart and my life? That is an exciting thought. I welcome the activities of the Chickasaw Church and the collective life of my church that will impact my life. I will engage in weekly Sunday school class times. I will worship our Savior each week with my church family. I will sing and I will pray. I will absorb the truths of the Bible through the weekly sermons. I will receive the blessings of communion. These are the rhythms of my life and I welcome them. There will be special times of baptism and confirmation. Weddings and funerals will take place this coming year, though not likely my own.

I want to enter into those experiences from his entry into Jerusalem on a donkey, his actions in the temple, the last supper in the upper room, washing the disciples' feet, praying in Gethsemane,

Some of the most compelling research on "Sticky Faith" – that is, ensuring that young people don't walk away from God when they graduate high school – has shown the importance of "keychain leadership" in a church.

The people most trusted in an organization are often given a set of keys to the building – and the more keys they have, the more "power" they typically possess. Sticky Faith asks us to think about keys not as a literal tangible privilege from something jingling in your pocket, but rather as something symbolic of the capabilities, access, and opportunities that you gift young people with when you entrust them with leadership and a voice in the church.

This Advent Season I was bursting with gratitude for all the "keys" given to our student ministry by their church family. There were so many ways they showed up and served! From actively helping to get the church building and grounds ready for Advent, serving breakfast on "their Sunday," to showing up in full force representing the church by singing Christmas songs as they rang the Salvation Army bell, to riding in the city of Chickasaw's Christmas parade (and throwing a meaningful message to the parade watchers), and Christmas Caroling to some of the saints of our church. On Christmas Eve weekend, they directed and took active parts in the Children's Christmas program, taught Sunday School, and totally independent of any adult presence, ran the sound, slides, and live feed for the Candlelight Christmas Eve Service.

When you entrust the "keys" of the church to our young people, they will trust you with their time, their hearts, their energy, their creativity, and their friends...and then we all grow more Christ-like as we fully welcome the children (and teenagers!) among us in His name.

January 16th @ 9:30am



The last year has brought about more change for me than I think I've ever experienced in this amount of time. Some of the change was welcomed, but most of it was not what I wanted or anything I was comfortable with. In fact, a lot of it left me grieving deeply.
