# PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

#### **Redeeming Regret**

"(Jesus said) I have brought you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began." John 17:4-5

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." 2 Timothy 4:7

I guess each one of us has heard the phrase, "What are you going to give up for Lent?" I want to ask everyone in our church to take a new approach to giving things up for Lent by seeking to give our regrets to God. There is that saying that goes, "Everyone has an opinion, and everyone likes theirs the best." I started thinking about how we all have regrets, but we don't like them at all! The scripture above from the Book of John is absolutely amazing. Jesus said this sentence at the end of His life. Jesus had no regrets if he said such a strong sentence. Then there is the incredible sentence in 2 Timothy where Paul is at the end of his life, and he conveys that same amazing attitude of no regrets. We see from these two scriptures that our Lord wants us to be free from our regrets and we can end our lives with a clean conscience.

I first felt God giving me the nudge to speak on regrets when I was talking to two wonderful Christian ladies in our church, and they asked me if I would preach on regrets and getting free from them. It was more than they asked me to preach on this topic, it was the sound of their voices that compelled me to see the need to speak on regret. Well, there are eight preaching opportunities for me during the season of Lent if we count Ash Wednesday. As I was studying about regret and organizing sermons on the topic, I quickly came to see this is a bigger topic than I realized. There is a lot more attached to regret than meets the eye. I hope you will be with us every Sunday during Lent.

Jesus achieved a mighty and powerful victory in His death and resurrection. The victory that Jesus achieved was for us. Jesus didn't need to be set free from what binds us. Jesus in His amazing love for us, faced all the work of the cross and the resurrection to set us free from our fears, our selfishness, or sins, our pain and our regrets.

I know some will say that "regrets really aren't that big of deal." As I studied on the topic, I began to see that regrets are a big deal. Regrets are one of the things in life that prevent us from receiving Love from God and giving love to others. We don't want to have feel any more pain of regret, so we shut down certain areas of our lives. It is not God's will that we go through life feeling afraid or partially asleep. So, let's all meet with Jesus though Holy Spirit so we may find freedom from our regrets.

Finally, I am so excited about our Lent Devotional book that will be a key element of our Lent experience this year! We have 36 devotionals written by people in our church and we have four from some of our saints of old. I have read these devotionals, and they are full of spiritual fire. You do not want to miss out on this experience. Then on each Sunday in the book - the sermon title, scripture, and the main idea of the message for that Sunday's worship service are printed. I believe God just doesn't want to a special work in just few people's lives in our church this Lent. I believe God has a profound work that He is seeking to do through all parts of our church. I am convinced that God is wanting to bring a powerful move of His Spirit all through our church. So please, please, pick up a book on Ash Wednesday, March 5th or on the first Sunday, March 9th. God has wonderful gifts for us this Lent.



We were all able to step away from the distractions of the world and encounter God in a powerful way. Through worship, prayer, and engaging sessions, hearts were stirred, faith was strengthened, and commitments to Christ were renewed. It was a time of refreshment and spiritual breakthroughs!

Wednesday nights were also a huge blessing, as we continued diving into God's truth through discipleship-focused lessons. After months of collecting "llama bucks" for attendance, serving, participation, and scripture memory, we held our long awaited "Auction." Students were able to "redeem" the llama bucks they had earned and saved for fabulous auction items like video games, headphones, candy, and even cool socks and stuffed animals. To be honest, I wasn't quite sure how the Llama Bucks project would really turn out. It was important that it not be just another "reward points" program – but that it be an exercise in and reinforcement of honoring commitments, sacrificing momentary pleasure for long-term joy, and the value of saving.

Even with all those important lessons, I prayed that there would be a deeper, disciple-making truth that would resonate with our teenagers from this process. And, true to who He is, God always provides more than we can ask or imagine! The Llama Bucks Auction took place directly following our Wednesday Night series on "Sneaky Sins" (like pride, gossip, and comparison). And so trading the flimsy pieces of paper for something of greater value, was a powerful, tangible way to learn the meaning of the word "Redemption." Sin separates us from God, but 1 Peter 1:18-19 shows us it's not money that redeems us from the emptiness of the world, but the precious blood of Jesus. It is our prayer that the "Lessons of the Llama Bucks" will outlast the items they worked so hard to purchase, as they remember the love and sacrifice of their Savior for the rest of their days.

Another beautiful experience of February was our Saturday morning "Connections" group that met at Rooted and Grounded Coffee Shop. Our older teens/ young adults are wanting to study and discuss more spiritually advanced topics than we can address in traditional "youth group." We are working hard to establish a monthly Saturday morning tradition of meeting at a local coffee shop to discuss passages of scripture more in depth and learn how they can be applied to our lives.

WORSHIP LEADER



James 4:8: "Come near to God and he will come near to you"."

Angle and I were playing at a rehab facility years ago and one of the guys that was staying there at the time started talking to me about playing the guitar. He said that he plays sometime but didn't have a pick to play with, so I gave him a couple of mine. The guy was very appreciative and thanked me very much for the picks and said that he liked them. I explained to him why I used those particular picks and we spoke for a few more minutes then he walked away.

One of the people that was serving with us that day overheard the conversation and said that the guy that got the picks seemed very excited about receiving them. My response was that picks are very important. I explained to him that the pick is what gives you the connection between you and the guitar. If you don't have a pick you can play with your fingers but it is hard to do if you're not used to it. Plus, the strumming is different. A pick that doesn't feel right or is thicker or thinner than you need for what you are playing will cause you to strum too hard or too soft and it just throws off your playing. You have to adjust your playing style to the pick that you are playing with and sometimes that just causes you to feel off and messes up your playing.

I have always remembered that conversation because of my personal connection to guitars and how it relates to our relationship with God and our worship to God. If you don't have a pick to connect you with the Instrument then you're not able to fully interact with the instrument. You may experience the same outcome if you aren't using the correct pick or even the wrong pick. Jesus is our connection to God and when the "Pick" isn't there or we aren't in the correct place with the "Pick", then we can't get our relationship and worship in sync. They will always feel off.

Here are some ways to help you find the right "pick" for you so that you can reconnect, grow, or strengthen your relationship with and worship to God. Choose a version of the Bible that you can read and understand. Use a Bible concordance and commentary. These are available in apps and online if you prefer digital. If songs from the hymnal help you connect better then come to the 11am service. If there are some newer songs that you have heard that help you connect with God then come to the 9am service. Try out a small group or go out to one of the events like Chickasaw Diners to help get you connected.

Find a pick that helps you connect and draw near to God. He is certainly anxious to draw near to you but sometimes we pile up our hurts, life problems, opinions, anger, time, or generic excuses to keep us from playing. God has the right pick for you and I'm certain He would love to give it to you so that there will be less reasons to put down the guitar instead of playing every chance you get.









## Altar Flowers
